
# The Center for Policy Evaluation



Conducting evaluations to support implementation of evidence-based policies and programs in VA

The Center for Policy Evaluation (CPE) conducts rigorous evaluations supporting the implementation of evidence-based policies and programs in the US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). Leveraging our advanced methodological skills, we work with operational partners to conduct evaluations, using both existing administrative data and prospective designs, to provide insights into causal mechanisms. Studies employing causal inference are a powerful tool for operational decision-making, by clarifying treatment effects of interest and providing unbiased estimates of them.

# **Center Organization**



### The Three Cores of CPE

- 1. **Methods Core**: This core designs and conducts evaluations to identify the causal effects of policies and programs.
- 2. **Learning and Translation Core**: This core identifies opportunities to implement and disseminate findings from the Methods Core, thereby helping VA translate science into action as a learning health care system.
- 3. **Operations Core**: This core coordinates efforts and communication within the center, with operational leaders, and other QUERI centers.



# Combining Qualitative and Quantitative Methods Across a Wide Range of VA Priority Areas

The Center is led by Drs. Todd Wagner, David Chan, and Anita Vashi. The leadership team has unparalleled experience in conducting rigorous health services and health economic research with VA operational groups. Supporting the leadership team are 30 VA investigators with diverse content expertise to support evaluations in top priority areas, particularly in:



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#### **Priority Areas for CPE**

- Community care and access
- Virtual care
- Long term, home-based and palliative care
- Disparities and social determinants of health
- Suicide and mental health
- Delayed care from COVID

**Methodological expertise**: Center investigators have experience with causal interference methods, machine learning, prospective evaluations, and qualitative and Mixed Methods.

**Veteran Engagement and Diversity**: Center engages Veterans in its evaluations. CPE is also committed to improving diversity, inclusion, and equity through ongoing initiatives at VA Palo Alto and Stanford University.

# **Evaluations and Core Data Resources**

Along with the two evaluations below, core data resources are created to improve the quality and speed of subsequent evaluations by characterizing each VA medical center and their local market conditions.

#### Evaluation 1: Evaluating Suicide-Prevention Efforts and the Role of Veterans' Disability Benefits

Project Team: Led by Dr. Kritee Gujral with assistance from Drs. Liam Rose and Todd Wagner

#### Goals

 To estimate causal effect of VA's disability-related benefits & policies on Veteran suicide, suicide-related ED visits, & suiciderelated behaviors

#### **Operational Partners**

- Office of Mental Health & Suicide Prevention
- Office of Enterprise Integration

#### Methods

 Use a regression discontinuity design to compare outcomes for Veterans just below & just above a given disability score associated with substantial VA benefits

#### Impacts

 Provide VA with evidence to guide VBA and VHA policy when it comes to benefits and mental health

#### **Evaluation 2: Evaluation of VA Health Connect**

Project Team: Led by Drs. Diem Tran, Liam Rose, Jaqueline Ferguson, and Anita Vashi

#### Goals

- To assess effectiveness of VA Health Connect to streamline access to care & maximize first-contact resolution in improving Veteran access to timely, quality care compared to care as usual prior to implementation
- To examine if program improves access to timely highquality care, & if effects are equitably distributed, or disproportionately benefits tech savvy patients

#### Operational Partner

- Integrated Veterans Care
- National Emergency Medicine Program Office

#### Impacts
