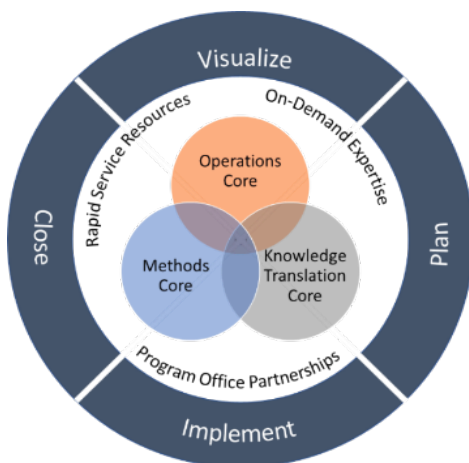

## HERMES Evaluations: Essential Features

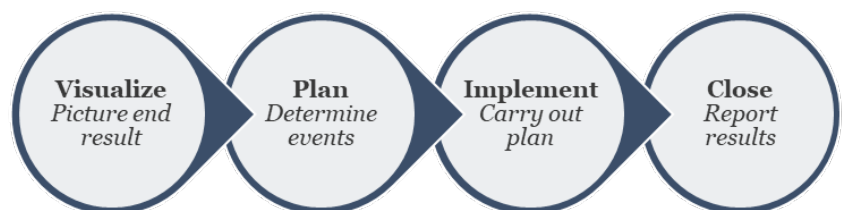

- **Operations:** HERMES partners with the Houston VA Center for Innovation (COIN), the premier health services research center in the Southwest US, and has longstanding relationships with national VA program offices.
- **Evaluation Model:** HERMES evaluations follow the Practical, Robust Implementation and Sustainability Model (PRISM), aligned with QUERI's existing Roadmap to Implementation.

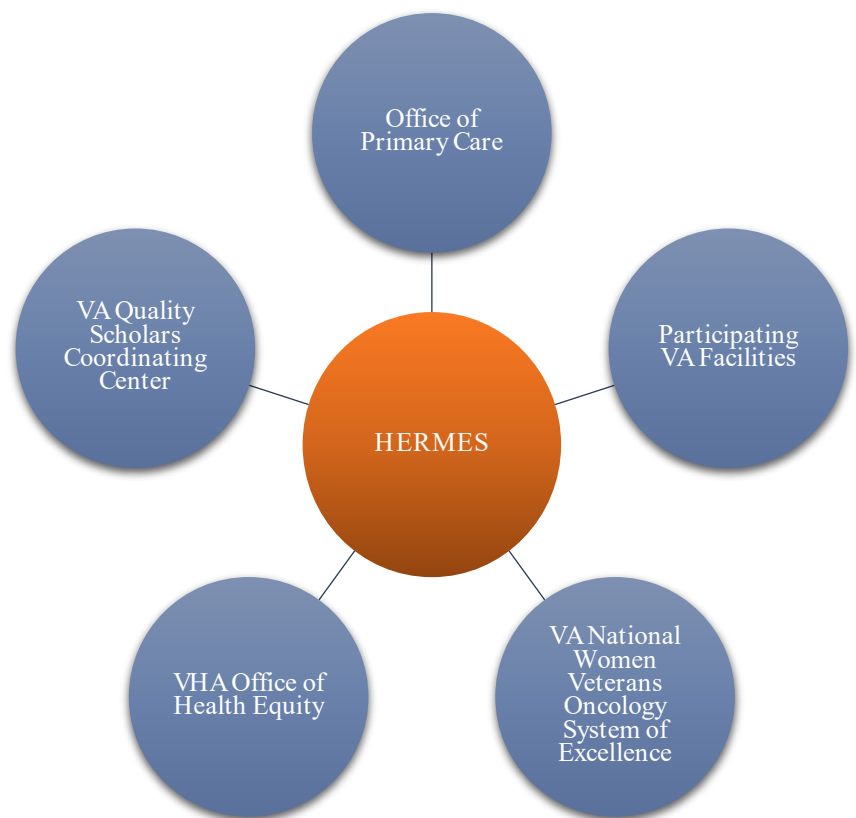
## Intended Impacts and Dissemination
